S S 1951 Vol 17 (complete)

S S 1952 Vol 18 (complete) (Issue 2, and 3, Given as Vol 8 instead of Vol 18

Page 189/191. wrong number because it is about the meeting at Birmingham and **the text seems to follow on naturally** and then finishes signed by Fred Day at Birmingham)

S S 1953 Vol 19 (complete) (Issue 3, is titled wrong Vol 20 03 1954 page numbers give sequence show it is Vol 19 03 1953)

S S 1954 Vol 20 to S S 1956 Vol 22 (complete)

S S 1957 Vol 23 (complete) Issue 11 November is wrongly marked Issue 10

S S 1958 Vol 24 to S S 1960 Vol 26 (complete)

S S 1961 Vol 27 (complete) (1961 = 1,2,3, 4, is marked Vol 27)

S S 1961 Vol 28 (complete) (The rest of 1961 is marked as Vol 28 Issue Vol 28 04 is May Instead of 05 then six is back on track as Vol 28 06 June)

S S 1962 Vol 29 (complete) (Printer accidentally switched page Numbering from 135 straight to 156)

S S 1963 Vol 30 to S S 1972 Vol 39 (complete)

S S 1973 Vol 40 (Complete)! (May 2nd and 3rd page is mixed up but the page order is correct P49-51)

S S 1974 Vol 42 (complete) Nancy Wardrop 1974 - January to May was Vol 41
The rest of that year are all Vol 42. Also No 6 (June) was No 5 by mistake.

S S 1975 Vol 43 (complete) 2 Issues different but have same No 8

S S 1976 Vol 44 to S S 1985 Vol 53 (complete)

S S 1986 Vol 54 (complete) (Question GM - Missing Issue 12?,)

ANSWER Nancy Wardrop 1986 - one missing? **No** - only 11 numbers were printed - none in April - there's an explanation on back of the May issue.

S S 1987 Vol 55 to S S 1992 Vol 60 (complete)

S S 1993 Vol 61 (complete) (Odd Issue Number?)

Nancy Wardrop 1993 – January numbered Vol 61 other 11 months were Vol 62

S S 1994 Vol 62 (complete) (Vol No problem?) **Question GM** Are there more of Vol 62/63 available or can I merge the two together to make one year

ANSWER Roseabelle Payne There does not seem to be any more magazines included in the error concerning the naming of Vols 62/63 so they can be merged as you suggest

ANSWER Nancy Wardrop 1994 and 1995 – were both numbered Vol 63

S S 1995 Vol 63 to S S 1996 Vol 64 (complete)

S S 1997 Vol 64 (complete) (Vol No problem?)

Answer Nancy Wardrop 1997 - Started Jan and Feb as Vol 65 then reverted to Vol 64 for the other 10

S S 1998 Vol 65 to S S 2014 Vol 81 (complete)

Nancy Wardrop – “One comment about the Date/Vol confusion –

I would use the dates. As far as I can see there have been a couple of occasions where the wrong volume No has been used - the year began with one Vol No and changed to the next one after a month or so.”

G.M. I am have made a complete index available in PDF which you ought to be able to put on your computer and sort and search articles as you wish.

(If you wanted to see all the articles by any writer, it would be easy to go to the Table, select the column "Author" and click "Sort A-Z." That would show them all together. It might not be so neat as applying a filter, but it is easy. Then sorting the column for "page numbers" would return the table to normal.

You can also turn a table into a spreadsheet by clicking on it, clicking on "select all" and then the ordinary "copy". Then open a new spreadsheet, click in the first cell, and click "paste." Drag the columns open to show all the work.

If this does not work, there is another method. Click the table, go to "table tools" above the toolbar and under it click "format". This brings up a ribbon, and at the right side of it look for "convert to text". Choose the option to "separate by tabs" and OK. Select all the resulting text and click "copy". Then open your new spreadsheet, click in the first cell and "paste". This should work
